

OLD TIMER OF THE WEEK

It is always a pleasure to interview a gracious lady and this week's honored employee RUTH COLLINS is a gracious lady in every sense of the word. From the moment she started here on May 1, 1928, she has been highly respected by all who knew her and in fact, has been a symbol of the type of dedication that made the old David Bradley Company great.

As soon as she graduated from high school at 16, RUTH came to Bradley to apply for a job but was not hired, because she looked so young. (She still does). Undismayed, she enrolled in a 10 month secretarial course at Gallagher Business College, which she finished in 8 months, worked briefly in a local clothing store and finally was hired here as a bookkeeper, an area she is still associated with. Long before Women's Lib, in '46 to be exact, her abilities were recognized and she was promoted to Supervision, and now 27 years later she is still the only woman on the Exempt Payroll.

In 1966, RUTH'S husband ED became ill and after an extended illness of over two years, he passed away in November 1968. During most of his illness, he required extensive care and yet RUTH very rarely failed to appear for work each day.

This great lady is childless, but lavishes all of her affection on her fifteen nieces and nephews and ten great nieces and nephews.
