WEDDINGS



PAYCHECKS

Payday is on Friday for employees on the 1st shift and on Thursday night for those who work on the second and third shifts. In all cases the checks are passed out on the job by the timekeeping department and foreman.

The payroll checks are made up in the Corporate Offices and are not received at Bradley until approximately noon on Thursday. On Friday, after they have been distributed throughout the plant those that are left are brought to the Personnel Office, where they can be picked up by their owners.

Of late there have been many cases of second and third shift employees coming into Personnel on Thursday (prior to their shift) and requesting their checks early. In a few cases the reasons given were legitimate but mostly the reasons were pure fabrications and several employees who received their checks early didn't even show up for work that day. As a result of the abuse of this privilege, DON BLANCHETTE Emp. Mgr. announces that no checks will be given out early from now on. There will be no exceptions.

The only people who will be given checks on Thursday prior to the beginning of the 2nd shift will be people who are no longer on payroll. Here again, a word of explanation may be in order. Plant employees at Bradley are paid each week for the work they performed the previous week. Thus if a man resigns or is taken off payroll he may have to wait a week or more to get all the wages owed him. For example suppose an employee quits abruptly after the end of his shift on a Wednesday. On the following afternoon he could pick up his check for the preceeding week, but would have to wait until the following Thursday afternoon to collect what he had earned Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the week in which he resigned. Clear? Of course, either or both check can be mailed to him if he so wishes.
