BLOOD PRESSURE PROGRAM

The Roper Corporation is vitally interested in protecting the health of its employees. One of the most important indicators of the physical well being of persons is their blood pressure. Blood pressure irregularities can signal serious cardio-vascular problems which, if detected early, may be successfully treated and controlled. Because of this, the company is initiating a complete Blood Pressure Program for all of its employees throughout the Corporation. We feel that this program can have very significant positive benefits. Although participation is voluntary, all employees are strongly encouraged to participate.

Specifically here at Bradley the program is already under way. Mrs. JANET RICE R.N. has been checking the blood pressure of employees in the Main Office area all week, and, when that phase of the operation has been completed, she will move out into the plant and check employees in the departmental offices. Blood pressure readings will be

orded on separate cards for each employee. These cards will be kept in the individuals personnel record. Also, each employee on the occasion of the check will be informed of his systolic and diastolic readings. If either reading is outside normal limits the employee will be given a special slip suggesting he make an appointment or otherwise get in touch with his personnel physician.

In the future, this program will be administered to all employees at least once a year.


Informative literature dealing with hypertension (High Blood Pressure) will be available to all employees at the time of their specific blood pressure check.


RETIREE
