### IMPORTANT! IMPORTANT!

If you are on layoff, if your insurance is still in force, and if you want to be sure it doesn't lapse, please read the following very carefully.

Certified letters were sent out this week to all employees currently on layoff reminding them that payments for insurance coverage for August are due and payable. The amount owed is shown in the letter and premiums must be paid by August 31. Payments will be accepted Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 3:30 P.M. and should be paid to Geri Johnson in the Personnel Office.

If there is no one at home when the letter is delivered to sign for it, the postman will leave a notice in your mailbox and return the letter to the post office until it is called for. If you get such a notice please pick up your letter immediately. If payment is not received by Aug. 31 your insurance coverage will lapse and you will be without insurance.

Employees who let their hospital and medical coverage lapse may reinstate but only after they have been recalled to work and request to be reinstated. It is requested that those who come in to pay please pay either by check, money order or have the exact amount in cash.
