THE MAKING OF A TRACTOR
PART III
Testing

Pictured are BOB FAENGER, Chief Test Engineer and DODE MEHRER, Model Shop Tester as they take a reading on the Rolling Chassis Dynamometer, a machine which is used to test the whole tractor; engine, transaxle, etc., and simulates actual running. Testing is a constant operation here at Bradley both on proposed new models and current models. In fact as problems arise with older models testing continues on these as well.

In addition to the dynomometer, there is also the test track located just north of the old foundry building where tractors can be seen in almost continuous operation. On this test track tractors are run constantly 24 hours a day six days a week and will average 500 miles on the track.

We also have a Florida test base at Fort Lauderdale where MERWIN BECKWITH is the Chief Test Engineer at that location and has four to seven people assisting him. There the tractors are tested under actual operating conditions with 90% grass mowing and 10% tilling. A great deal of our testing is for the benefit of our own quality control.

In addition to our own testing Sears tests our tractors extensively at the Morton Arboretum near Lisle, Illinois. Next week we will take a look at processing and tooling.

## SHOEMOBILE

The first 1976 visit of the Safety Shoemobile to our plant will be Wednesday, April 14. The unit will be here at the north guard house from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. At that time employees may purchase safety shoes available in many different styles that are fine shoes and very reasonably priced. Midwest Shoe Company personnel will be available to provide expert fitting. Shoes may be purchased by payroll deduction and can be paid in one, two or three deductions.

In addition the company will make a contribution of \$6.00 toward the price of each pair of shoes purchased. Last year when the company contribution was increased to \$6.00 it was announced that only two pairs per year could be purchased under this plan. This is still the case. Last year a few employees misunderstood this.

So there will be no misunderstanding this year let us explain. An employee can purchase as many pairs of safety shoes as he can afford and pay for them under the payroll deduction plan, but only two pairs per year can get the \$6.00 discount. All shoes over the two limit must be paid for at full price.

There will be two more shoemobile visits later this year, but any employees buying two pairs at this visit will not be able to purchase any more at future visits unless they are prepared to pay full price.

## NOBODY MISSES THE "5" PIN?


