INVENTORY AND VACATION SHUTDOWN

According to B. J. RANDALL, Vice President Employee Relations, Inventory will begin this year on Monday, June 27 and continue until finished. The inventory rate for 1977 is \$4.75 plus Cost of Living for all employees taking inventory.

Independence Day will be observed on Monday, July 4 1977.

The Plant will be closed for a three week vacation period beginning on Tuesday, July 5 and remain closed until operations resume on Tuesday, July 26 at 7 A. M.

As always, non production departments or service departments will need people working during the shutdown. Employees in these areas should, as soon as possible, contact their supervisor to schedule their vacations. Every effort will be made to schedule these vacations in accordance with the wishes of the employees. Also, any employees in production departments who might be required to work during the shutdown will be notified by their supervisor.

We would like all employees, with more than three weeks of vacation coming, to work with their supervisors so that suitable arrangements can be made for the balance of their vacation time. Here again, every effort will be made to comply with the requests of the employees involved.

For employees who have less than three weeks of vacation time coming, every effort will be made to find work for them through the shutdown period if they want to work. In the very near future a notice will be posted so these employees can sign up to work during the shutdown period.
