Children nineteen (19) to twenty three (23) years of age are also eligible if they are unmarried, full-time academic students and are primarily dependent upon you for support.

Even if you are paying for their coverage and they are not full-time, unmarried academic students, coverage will not be given.


HOSPITAL INSURANCE CLAIMS
