HISTORY OF BRADLEY-BOURBONNAIS COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL

The present Bradley school was established in 1895. Prior to this time the public school for Bradley was located in Bourbonnais.

In 1890 a private school was conducted here by Mr. A. Seaman. School was conducted in an old store building on South Washington Avenue; later in the Methodist Church, and the Woodman Building until 1894, when a unit of our present school building was constructed.

The first frame school building was remodeled in 1898. In 1911 an adjoining brick building was constructed and in 1913 was increased to its present size.

The first high school was established in 1898 by Professor Sutton but was discontinued in 1903. Established again in 1909, by Professor Hartleb. there was a graduating class of two students. The enrollment steadily increased to the present student body numbering 210 and a graduating class of 45.

The faculty and curriculum steadily increased so that now they are on a parity with schools that are much larger and better equipped. The Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School has always been fortunate in securing a superior faculty that has advanced the school to its present scholastic standing.

The student body of today, as well as those of the past, is also to be complimented. All are children of working parents who realize the necessity for better education and have made many sacrifices to attain this goal.



SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

In 1938, eighty-six green Freshmen began a flight, laden with hopes of success. For a trustworthy pilot, they elected Lloyd McCleary; co-pilot, Orville Bennett; the crew—Secretary John McCue and Treasurer Howard Larson. As chief operator, Mr. Arthur kept the class to its course. We soon settled down to our every-day assignments and tasks.

In our Sophomore year, we elected John McCue, pilot; Walter Johnson, co-pilot; Bill Lucas, keeper of the records, and Thomas McCoy. keeper of the funds. We had dwindled to seventy in number, but still comprised a large portion of the enrollment of B. B. C. H. S. We sponsored a few movies to start our "bank roll rolling", and gave some parties for our own amusement

At last, we reached the "stratosphere"—we were Juniors! Darlene Marquis, John McCue, Irene Beach, and Howard Larson took over the ship, which carried fifty-eight passengers through the year 1940-41. Miss Kuehne assisted Mr. Arthur in keeping us correctly on our course, which was especially difficult that year due to the heavy responsibility of the Junior-Senior Prom. Means of making money was our first problem. Everyone had to make a small sacrifice out of his weekly allowance to pay his dues, but the class was supported. We sold candy, pop, and ice cream at the football and basketball games. Later in the year we raffled a turkey, sponsored skating parties, sold pencils, and sponsored a Junior Class Play, "Linda Lou". For the Prom we tried a new system—each Junior and Senior was permitted to invite one outside guest to the dance after the banquet, an innovation which proved quite satisfactory.

We've reached our destination—we're Seniors now! And what pleasure it is! Lloyd McCleary, who piloted the ship through its first year, was honored with the class presidency again. Dolores Martin, vice-president, seems capable of taking over for him whenever the occasion arises. Irene Beach has had so much experience with the minutes that she is again secretary, and Clifford Coash has been chosen treasurer.

Some of the boys who have remained outstanding in athletics during their high school careers are Roman Smietanski, Clifford Coash, Dick Winters, Victor Wasetis, Walter Johnson, Leonard Bujnowski, John McCue, Warren VanKuren, and Howard Larson.

Our last year has been a busy one—annual pictures, class rings, commencement announcements, all of the things that mean that we are about to come in for a perfect three-point landing with forty-five: aboard, the largest class yet to graduate from B. B. C. H. S.


