We entered into the fourth and final phase of our sea cruise with forty-four hands and a great determination to make it a huge success. Our Commanding Officers were Miss Allison and Mr. Walters. We were under the capable command of Captain Bill Mayotte. We chose as our secondary officers James Bass, Beverly Pattengale, and Robert Bourelle. Under their leadership we attained a high degree of companionship. We then set out to make preparations for our graduation. Our trip will soon be over and we will enter our chosen professions.

In future years we hope to get together for another cruise.
